## Tips for a good YB shot

- Turn on all classroom lights (most teachers have some or all of them off). If you ask to turn them on for picture taking, most are fine with it.
- 
- Try to get kids looking AT camera. Looking down does not translate to paper well
- 
- NO bunny ears, or finger poses that look like guns (peace signs and fun poses ok)
- 
- When taking a group shot, best to have teacher line them up. Sometimes standing on a chair ensures that you will see students in back row.
- 
- Take two or three shots of kids in same pose, that way you can pick the best one.
- 
- If you have an action setting on your camera, it helps since most kids tend to move at all times.
- 
- Get close-up, These photos could be shrunk down to a 1 inch photo in some cases, if your photo is too far away, it will not turn out.
- 
- More than one child in your photos is a good rule of thumb. (We have on average 650 students and 76 pages to represent our student body)
